1. About this Report


Introduction: It is mandatory for a Club to prepare an Annual Report that reflects how it (Club) has fared during the year. Besides certain static information like the Club Charter, Club Constitution and Bye-laws etc., it also contains the financial status of the Club and its activities. The present Report has tried to bring out all these points for the year 2020-21 for the Rotary Club of Bhubaneswar Heritage (RCBH).

A Snapshot of Club Performance: The Club has performed very well during 2020-21. This is, in spite of the COVID Pandemic that has ravaged the country and Odisha is not an exception to this. During 2020-21, the Club added 13 new members to the 61 existing as of 1st July, 2020 but lost 3 (One passed away and two changed location and did not pay). The Club has achieved almost all targets set for the mandatory internal commitments. Besides, it has taken a number of Service and Community Activities. The Club had 43 weekly meetings (as against the target of 40) and 16 Speaker Meetings (as against the target of 12). In addition, it has achieved the targets set for Business Meetings (12) and Board Meetings (8). It has paid all dues to RI, District and Rotary News. It has been able to bring out 12 E-Bulletins and one Special Bulletin to mark the Installation Ceremony and Charter Day Celebration that were held together on 25th August, 2020. The Club also observed several International Days like, Polio Day, Hand Washing Day, Diabetes Day, AIDS Day, Toilet Day, Women's Day, Health Day and so on. From 1st November, 2020, the Club introduced an innovative program, called, "My Success, My Pride", in which members were encouraged to speak on their successful achievements in their public life. There was overwhelming response to this. The Club organized special discussion sessions on contemporary topics of national interest like, National Education Policy, 2020, National Budget for 2021-22 etc. A mandatory District Program on Environment was organized jointly with the Rotary Club of Bhubaneswar New Horizon on 12th and 13th December, 2020. The Club has also very successfully organized the official visit of our smiling DG, Rtn. Shri Saumya Ranjan Mishra on 11th June, 2021. It has released the Club Directory & launched its own Club Website.

Acknowlwdgement: We thank our members for their participation in Club meetings and also in various Club activites. The guidance received from the Board Members was of great help for which we express our sincere thanks. We gratefully acknowledge the encouragement received from our smiling DG, Rtn. Shri Saumya Ranjan Mishra, from time to time, including his words of apprecediation during his official visit to our Club. Our Club Adviser, Rtn. Shri Ashok K. Tripathy, was always a source of inspiration to us and his timely advice on several occasions was of great help for which we express our gratitude. Our CP Rtn. Debabrata Panigrahi has always extended his positive reponse to our issues, from time to time, for which we are grateful to him. We received strong support from our past Presidents, Messers Rtn.Shri Santanu K. Mishra, Rtn. Shri Vinod Kumara and IPP Dr.Sarangadhar Samal for which we owe them a lot. The Club Executive Secretary Shri Sadananda Behera's support is gratefully acknowledged so also the help from Shri Kanhu Charan Nayak, on financial matters. (both from ODM). Recommended Rotary Club By-Laws

Bylaws of the Rotary Club of Bhubaneswar Heritage

Note:- These bylaws are recommended only and may be changed by any Rotary club to meet its own conditions, provided such changes are not out of harmony with the standard Rotary Club Constitution and with the RI constitution, RI bylaws and the Rotary Code of policies. If any doubt exists, the proposed charges should be submitted to the general secretary for the consideration of the Board of Directors of RI.

Article 1 Definitions.

Board : The Board of Directors of this club.

Director : A member of this club's Board of Directors.

Member : A member, other than an honorary member, of this club.

4. RI : Rotary International.

Year : The twelve - month period that begins on 1 July.

Article 2 Board.

The Governing body of the club shall be the board consisting of 11 (Eleven) members of this club, namely, the president, vice president, president elect (or president –nominee, if no successor has been elected), secretary, treasurer and the sergeant at aims. At the discretion of the board also added can be _____ directors elected in accordance with article 3, section 1 of these bylaws, and the immediate past president.

Article 3 Election of Directors and Officers

Section 1 – At a regular meeting one month prior to the meeting for election of officers, the presiding officer shall ask for nominations by members of the club for president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and 5 (five) directors. The nominations may be presented by a nominating committee or by members from the floor, by either or by both as a club may determine. If it is determined to use a

nominating committee, such committee shall be appointed as the club may determine. The nominations duty made shall be placed on a ballot in alphabetical order under each office and shall be voted for at the annual meeting. The candidates for president, vice president, secretary and treasurer receiving a majority of the votes shall be declared elected to their respective officers. The ____ candidate for director receiving a majority of the votes shall be declared elected as directors. The candidate for president elected in such balloting shall be the president nominee and serve as a director for the year commencing on the first day of July next following the election and shall assume office as president on 1 July immediately following that year. The president nominee shall take the title of president – elect on 1 July in the year prior to taking office as president.

Section 2 – The officers and directors, so elected, together with the immediate past president shall constitute the board. Within one week after their election, the directors elect shall meet the elect some member of the club to act as sergeant at arms.

Section 3 – A vacancy in the board or any office shall be filled by action of the remaining directors.

Section 4 – A vacancy in the position of any officer elect or director elect shall be filled by action of the remaining directors elect.

Article 4 Duties of Officers.

Section 1 – President. It shall be the duty of the president to preside at meetings of the club and the board and to perform other duties as ordinarily pertain to the office of president.

Section 2 – President elect. It shall be the duty of the president elect to serve as a director and to perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the president or the board.

Section 3 – Vice President.-It shall be the duty of the vice president to preside at meetings of the club and the board in the absence of the president and to perform other duties as ordinarily pertain to the office of vice president.

Section 4 – Secretary:-It shall be the duty of the secretary to keep membership records, record attendance at meetings send out notices of club, board and committee meetings record and preserve the minutes of such meetings report as required to RI, including the semiannual reports of membership on 1 January and 1 July of each year, which shall include per capita dues for all members and prorated dues for active members who have been elected to membership in the club since the start of the July or January semiannual reporting period, report changes in membership, provide the monthly attendance report which shall be made to the district governor within 15 days of the last meeting of the month, collect and remit RI of official magazine subscriptions and the perform other duties as usually certain to the office of secretary.

Section 5 – Treasurer: It shall be the duty of the treasurer to have custody of all funds according for it to the club annual and at any other time upon demand by the board, and to perform other duties as pertains to the office of treasurer. Upon retirement from office, the treasure shall turn over to the incoming treasurer to the president all funds , books of accounts or any other club property.

Section 6 – Sergeant at Arms. The duties of the sergeant at aims shall be such as are usually prescribed for such office and other duties as may be prescribed by the president or the board.

Article 5 Meetings

Section 1 – Annual Meeting: An annual meeting of this club shall be held on the December in each year, at which time the election of officers and directors to serve for the ensuing year shall take place.

Section 2 – The regular weekly meetings of this club shall be held on Friday at Hotel The Empires, Saheed Nagar, Bhubaneswar at 7.30 PM. Due notice of any changes in or canceling of the regular meeting shall be given to all members of the club. All members excepting an honorary member (or member excused pursuant to the standard Rotary club constitution) in good standing in this club, on the day of the regular meeting, must be counted as present or absent, and attendance must be evidenced by the members being present for at least sixty (60) percent of the

time devoted to the regular meeting, either at this club or at any other Rotary club, or as otherwise provided in the standard Rotary Club constitution, article 9 sections 1 and 2.

Section 3 – One third of the membership shall constitute a quorum at the annual and regular meetings of this club.

Section 4 – Regular meetings of the board shall be held on 3rd Week of each month. Special meetings of the board shall be called by the president, whenever deemed necessary, or upon the request of two (2) directors, due notice having been given.

(Note:-Article 6, section 2 of the standard Rotary Club Constitution provides that "An annual meeting for the election of officers shall be held not later than 31 December...")

Section 5 - A majority of the directors shall constitute a quorum of the board.

Article 6 Fees and Dues

Section 1 – The admission fee shall be INR 2,000 to be paid before the applicant can qualify as a member, except as provided for in the standard Rotary club constitution, article 11.

Section 2 – The membership dues shall be INR 10,000 per annum payable semiannually on the first day of July and January with the understanding that a portion of each semiannual payment shall be applied to each member's subscription to the RI official magazine.

Article 7 Method of Voting

The business of this club shall be transacted by viva voce "Vote except the election of officers and directors, which shall be by ballot. The board may determine that a specific resolution be considered by ballot rather than by viva voce vote.

Article 8 Four Avenues of Service

The four Avenues of Service are the philosophical and practical frame work for the work of this Rotary club. They are club service, vocational service, community service and international service. This club will be active in each of the four Avenues of service.

Article 9 Committees

Club committees are charged with carrying out the annual and long range goals of the club based on the four Avenues of Service. The President and immediate past president should work together to ensure continuity of leadership and succession planning. When feasible committee members should be appointed to the same committee for three years to ensure consistency. The president –elect is responsible for appointing committee members to fill vacancies, appointing committee chairs and conducting planning meetings prior to the start of the year in office. It is recommended that the chair have previous experience as a member of the committee. Standing committees should be appointed as follows.

Members:- The committee should develop and implement a comprehensive plan for the recruitment and retention of members.

Club Public Relations: This committee should develop and implement plans to provide the public with information about Rotary and to promote the clubs service projects and activities.

Club Administration: This committee should conduct activities associated with the effective operation of the club.

Service Projects:- This committee should develop and implement educational, humanitarian and vocational projects that address the needs of its community and communities in other countires.

The Rotary Foundation: This committee should develop and implement plans to support. The Rotary Foundation through both financial contributions and program participation.

Additional ad hoc committees may be appointed as needed.

- (a) The president shall be ex officio a member of all committees and, as such, shall have all the privileges of membership thereon.
- (b) Each committee shall transact its business as is delegated to it in these bylaws and such additional business as may be referred to it by the president or the board. Except where special authority is given by the board, such committees shall not take action until a report has been made and approved by the board.
- (c) Each chair shall be responsible for regular meetings and activities of the committee, shall supervise and coordinate the work of the committee, and shall report to the board on all committee activities.

(Note: The above committee structure is in harmony with both the District Leadership Plan and the Club Leadership Plan. Clubs have the discretion to create any committees that are required to effectively meet its service and fellowship needs. A sample listing of such optional committees is found in the Club Committee Manual. A club may develop a different committee structure as needed.)

Article 10 Duties of Committees

The duties of all committees shall be established and reviewed by the president for his or her year. In declaring the duties of each, the president shall reference to appropriate RI materials. The service projects committee will consider the Avenues of Vocational Service, Community Service, and International Service when developing plans for the year.

Each committee shall have a specific mandate, clearly defined goals, and action plans established by the beginning of each year for implementation during the course of the year. It shall be the primary responsibility of the president-elect to provide the necessary leadership to prepare a recommendation for club committees, mandates, goals, and plans for presentation to the board in advance of the commencement of the year as noted above.

Article 11 Leave of Absence

Upon written application to the board, setting forth good and sufficient cause, leave of absence may be granted excusing a member from attending the meetings of the club for a specified length of time.

(Note: Such leave of absence does operate to prevent a forfeiture of membership; it does not operate to give the club credit for the member's attendance. Unless the member attends a regular meeting of some other club, the excused member must be recorded as absent except that absence authorized under the provisions of the Standard Rotary Club Constitution is not computed in the attendance record of the club.)

Article 12 Finances

Section 1 - Prior to the beginning of each fiscal year, the board shall prepare a budget of estimated income and expenditures for the year, which shall stand as the limit of expenditures for these purposes, unless otherwise ordered by action of the board. The budget shall be broken into two separate parts: one in respect of club operations and one in respect of charitable/service operations.

Section 2 - The treasurer shall deposit all club funds in a bank, named by the board. The club funds shall be divided into two separate parts: club operations and service projects.

Section 3 - All bills shall be paid by the treasurer or other authorized officer only when approved by two other officers or directors.

Section 4 - A thorough review of all financial transactions by a qualified person shall be made once each year.

Section 5 - Officers having charge or control of club funds shall give bond as required by the board for the safe custody of the funds of the club, cost of bond to be borne by the club.

Section 6 - The fiscal year of this club shall extend from 1 July to 30 June, and for the collection of members' dues shall be divided into two (2) semiannual periods extending from 1 July to 31 December, and from 1 January to 30 June. The payment of per capita dues and RI official magazine subscriptions shall be made on 1 July and 1 January of each year on the basis of the membership of the club on those dates.

Article 13 Method of Electing Members

Section 1 - The name of a prospective member, proposed by an active member of the club, shall be submitted to the board in writing, through the club secretary. A transferring or former member of another club may be proposed to active membership by the former club. The proposal shall be kept confidential except as otherwise provided in this procedure.

Section 2 - The board shall ensure that the proposal meets all the classification and membership requirements of the standard Rotary club constitution.

Section 3 - The board shall approve or disapprove the proposal within 30 days of its submission and shall notify the proposer, through the club secretary, of its decision.

Section 4 - If the decision of the board is favorable, the prospective member shall be informed of the purposes of Rotary and of the privileges and responsibilities of membership, following which the prospective member shall be requested to sign the membership proposal form and to permit his or her name and proposed classification to be published to the club.

Section 5 - If no written objection to the proposal, stating reasons, is received by the board from any member (other than honorary) of the club within seven (7) days following publication of information about the prospective member, that person, upon payment of the admission fee (if not honorary membership), as prescribed in these bylaws, shall be considered to be elected to membership.

If any such objection has been filed with the board, it shall vote on this matter at its next meeting. If approved despite the objection, the proposed member, upon payment of the admission fee (if not honorary membership), shall be considered to be elected to membership.

Section 6 - Following the election, the president shall arrange for the new member's induction, membership card, and new member Rotary literature. In addition, the president or secretary will report the new member information to RI and the president will assign a member to assist with the new member's assimilation to the club as well as assign the new member to a club project or function.

Section 7 - The club may elect, in accordance with the standard Rotary club constitution, honorary members proposed by the board.

Article 14 Resolutions

The club shall not consider any resolution or motion to commit the club on any matter until the board has considered it. Such resolutions or motions, if offered at a club meeting, shall be referred to the board without discussion

Article 15 Order of Business

- Meeting called to order.
- Introduction of visitors.
- Correspondence, announcements, and Rotary information.
- Committee reports if any.
- Any unfinished business.
- Any new business.
- Address or other program features.
- Adjournment.

Article 16 Amendments

These bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting, a quorum being present, by a two-thirds vote of all members present, provided that notice of such proposed amendment shall have been mailed to each member at least ten (10) days before such meeting. No amendment or addition to these bylaws can be made which is not in harmony with the standard Rotary club constitution and with the constitution and bylaws of RI.

- 03. Date of Establishment: The Society was established on 25th June, 2015.

Rules and Regulations of Rotary Club of Bhubaneswar Heritage (RCBH) Social Service Society

- 01. Short Title: These Rules and Regulations shall be called the Rules and Regulations of RCBH Social Service Society.
- 02. Location of the Registered Office of the Society: At: Plot No.30/A,Unit-3, Bhubaneswar-751001
- C3. Area of Operation / Jurisdiction: State of Orissa.
- 64. Symbol: Symbol of Rotary International will be adopted by the RCBH Social Service Society. In course of time a second Symbol will be developed.
- 05. Nature of Society: RCBH Social Service Society is the Community Service Wing of the Rotary Club of Bhubaneswar Heritage functioning under the Rotary District 3262.
- 06. Members :
 - (A) Eligibility:
 - All members of Rotary Club of Bhubaneswar Heritage shall be Members of the RCBH Social Service Society.
 - ii) He /She pay the prescribed annual fees as decided by the General Body of the Society from time to time.
 - (B) Term of Office of the Members:

A person will continue to be member of the RCBH Social Service Society, till he I she continues as Member of Rotary Club of Bhubaneswar Heritage.

- (C) Powers and Functions of the Members:
 - Participate in the Election of the Members of the Governing Body.
 - ii) Participate in the Governing Body meetings and various activities of the Society.
- 07. General Body:
- (A) Composition of the General Body.
 - The Society shall have a General Body composed of all Members of the Society. Quorum for the General Body: One third of its Members.
- (B) Powers and Functions of the General Body :

The General Body shall :-

- i) Formula policies to implement the objectives of the Society.
- ii) Elect the Members of the Governing Body.
- iii) Pass the Annual Report, Annual Budget and Audit Report(s) of the Society.
- 08. Governing Body:
- (A) Composition of the Governing Body:-

There shall be a Governing Body composed of the following office bearers and members

- i) President, ii) Vice-President, iii) Secretary, iv) Additional Secretary, v) Treasurer vi) Members -4.
- B) The Election and Term of Office of the Governing Body.:
 - i) The office bearers and members of Governing Body shall be nominated / elected from among the members of General Body on democratic principle.
 - ii) The term of Office of the Governing Body shall be one year. If election can not be held in time due to unavoidable circumstances, the Governing Body may remain in Office for a maximum period of three months after expiry of its term.
- (C)Meeting of the Governinfg Body:
 - i) The Governing Body shall meet not less than four times in a year.
 - ii) The Secretary shall convene meeting of the Governing Body as and when required for which minimum of 3 clear days notice shall be given.
 - iii)Quorum for the Governing Body shall be One-Third of its members (with the present strength of the Governing Body, it shall be three).

- D) Powers and Functions of Governing Body
 - To provide or purchase land, building premises, furniture equipment and other means needed for carrying on the work of the Society.
 - ii) To administer all properties and funds placed at the disposal of the Society for specified
 - iii) To raise funds and shall determine and provide ways and means for the raising of funds from the members as well as public.
 - To raise/receive funds in foreign currencies from foreign agencies as per FCRA provisions.
 - v) To enter into contract on behalf of the Society.
 - vi) To appoint Chairman of a Committee, who shall be charged with the responsibility of overall supervision and execution of a particular project within the framework prescribed by the Governing Body. The Chairman of the Committee may be entrusted with the responsibility to maintain accounts of a particular project.
 - vii) To delegate all or any of its powers to any committee constituted for any purpose or undertaking any specific community service activity of the Society.
 - viii) To determine the Administrative establishment of the Society their salaries and other emoluments, the conditions of service including appointment, termination, discipline leave, and other service matters.
 - ix) To determine the remuneration, travelling expenses, and allowances to be paid to persons lawfully engaged in the work of the Society.
 - x) To accept endowments, requests, donations, and transfer of any movable and immovable property of the Society on its behalf
 - xi) To make its own standing orders to regulate the disposal of its own business.
 - xii) To incur loan for the benefit of the Society
 - xiii) To determine the Bank in which the accounts of the Society shall be opened.
 - xiv) To pass the Annual Report, and Annual Budget of the Society for placement in the General
 - xv) To approve any new scheme of the Society.
 - xvi) To execute any other matter entrusted to it by the General Body.
 - xvii) The Governing Body shall cause minutes books to be kept of the proceedings of the meetings of the General Body and Governing Body.

09. Powers and Function of Office Bearers:

- A) Powers and Functions of President:
 - The President shall be the Chief Executive of the Society.
 - The President shall preside over all the meetings of the General Body and Governing Body convened from time to time.
 - iii) The President shall convene the Annual General Body Meeting, Special General Body Meeting, Governing Body Meeting, and such other meetings as may be required from time to
 - iv) The President shall be the custodian of the properties and documents of the Society.
 - v) The President shall collect funds and spend the same for the Society subject to the provisions of the budget approved by the General Body.
 - The President shall sign all documents letters, on behalf of the Society.
 - vii) The President shall also execute such other works as may be assigned by the Governing Body or General Body from time to time.
- B) Powers and Functions of the Vice-President: The Vice President shall exercise the powers and functions of the President in the absence of the latter or if the President so desires.
- C) Powers and Functions of the Secretary:
 - The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Governing Body and General Body.
 - ii) The Secretary shall execute various works as may be assigned by the President, Governing Body or General Body from time to time.
- D) Powers and Functions of the Additional Secretary: The Additional Secretary shall assist the Secretary in due discharge of his functions and act as the Secretary in his absence.

10. Accounts and Audit:

i) The Accounts of the Society shall be opened in any Scheduled Banks as decided by the

ii) The Bank Accounts of the Society shall be operated by two members of the Society to be determined by the Governing Body. One of the members to operate accounts could be Treasurer, Chairman / Members of various committees formed for projects and programmes may be authorized to operate the Bank Accounts of concerned activity.

iii)The accounts of the Society shall be audited annually by a qualified auditor or Government Auditor as the case may be. A copy of the Annual Audit Report will be sent to respective

funding agencies as well as to Registrar of Socities, Odisha, Cuttack.

11. Amendment: These rules shall not be repeated, amended or altered except by Resolution passed by majority of not less than three-fifth of the members of the General Body present at an Ordinary Meeting and confirmed by resolution passed by Extraordinary General Body Meeting of the Society.

12. Dissolution: The Society may be dissolved by 3/5" of Members. Upon dissolution of the Society its assets will be handed over to a similar registered society of to Government after clearing up all its debts and liabilities.

13. Legal Action: The Secretary may sue or be sued on behalf of the Society for movable and immovable properties.

14. Certified that there is no other registered Society in the same name and at the same place.

15. Certified that this is the true and correct copy of the Memorandum and Rules and Regulations of the Rotary Club of Bhubaneswar Heritage Social Service Society.

16. Certified that this is a non-political, non-profit charitable Society.

17. Certified that all legal matters have been guided by the Society as per rules of Society Act, 1860 and its Amendment, 1969.

B. COVID Awareness: This was done at a construction site in Daruthenga, in the outskirts of Bhubaneswar, for around 100 construction workers. As a part of this activity, masks @2 per person of different colours) and one soap per person was distributed to each worker. These workers were staying in a slum like colony near the construction site and were not having any mask and were not aware of the COVID guidelines.

2nd Weekly Meeting (Virtual) on 10th July 2020:

The President called the meeting to order and welcomed the participants. There were 13 participants. He then handed over the floor to Dr B.B.Samanta, Secretary, to present the Activity Report of the Secretary for the period 1st July, 2020 till date.Dr Samanta gave a brief account of the events that took place on 1st July and 7th July,

- This was followed by the release of the E-Bulletin of the Club prepared by the Club Editor Rtn. Shri Chinmoy Mohapatra. He (Dr. Minaketan) went through the entire bulletin of 10 pages and thanked Rtn. Mohpatra for his efforts. This was well appreciated by all the participants. This was a first of its kind for our club.
- The President then left the house open for comments and suggestions.
- Rtn. Shri Tripathy, Club Advisor welcomed the new members and wanted to know more about them. He asked for the orientation of new members and requested PP Rtn. Santanu Mishra to coordinate.
- He (Shri Tripathy) reiterated his suggestion to have a Directory of Club Members and wanted to have one-page profile of all members. Rtn. Shri Chinmoy Mohaptra was to prepare such a Directory wit help from President and Secretary.
- Rtn. Shri Vinod Kumar Ji suggested adequate light in the room of members so that their face is visible. He also suggested of using the option available in zoom to raise hands for any comments/suggestions.
- IPP Rtn. Dr Sarangdhar Samal, emphasized on membership drive and giving sufficient time for the date of Installation Ceremony for better participation. President clarified that there will be a combined Installation Day and Charter Day on 25th August, 2020. Whether it will be physical or virtual will depend upon the prevailing situation then.
- Dr P.Srinivas, proposed a vote of thanks.
- The meeting was adjourned after the National Anthem, sang by the members present. (Minutes sent on 14th July)

17th July 2020:

Distribution of fruit bearing trees was done in Bhalunka and Sabarsahi (two of our 5 adopted tribal villages). Each willing family was given 2 Jackfruits, 1 Jamun, 1 Bela and 1 Moringa. A total of 50 families were given these plants that added up to 250. Of this while 200 plants consisting of Jackfruit, Bela and Jamun (Jamukoli) were collected free by Rtn. Priadarshi Mohapatra, from J.K.Nursery, the 50 Moringa plants were purchased by the club with donation from Dr Samanta @ R. 6.50 per plant, from Government Nursery thanks to Rtn. Manmath K. Pani. The activity was undertaken under the overall guidance of Club Advisor, Shri Ashok Tripathy Sir.

Third Weekly cum 1st Business Meeting (Virtual) on 17th July, 2020:

The third weekly meeting (virtual) was held from 7-7.45 pm. This was also a Business Meeting and attended by 14 members, one more than the last weekly meeting.

At the outset, the President Rtn. Dr S. Minaketan welcomed the participants. He then asked Secretary Dr. Samanta to read out the minutes of the last week's meeting. While presenting the minutes Dr Samanta referred to the minutes of the last meeting already circulated and added the morning activity of distributing fruit bearing plants to families in two of the 5 adopted villages. The minutes were unanimously adopted. Dr Samanta notified that in view of the restrictions imposed on movement vehicles until 31st July, 2020, no field activity would be undertaken during the remaining part of the month. This can be reconsidered if things are relaxed in between, although the weekly meeting (Virtual) will be held as before.

On the issue of Speaker's Meeting, PP Run. Vend Kumar suggested that there was no need to have any such meeting relating to Covid-19 as there had been enough discussions on this in electronic and print media. President Dr. Minaketan requested the participating members to suggest topics that could be chosen for the next Speaker's meeting proposed to be held on 31 st July, 2020.

Dr Minaketan expressed his concern regarding the fees collected from the members. According him, as of 17th July, only half of the members had paid their dues and it is necessary to speed up the process. He also mentioned about the Invoice for Rs 1,92,239.25 received from RI towards half yearly payment. He requested CP Rtn. Shri Debabrata Panigrahi and PP Shri Santanu Mishra to take the follow up responsibility with the non-payers and advised Dr Samanta to share the list with them. This was agreed.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks by Rtn, Shri B.K.Sahoo and national anthem sung by the participating members. (Minutes shared on 21st July)

4th Weekly and 1st Speaker Meeting held on 24.07.2020 (Virtual):

The Fourth Weekly and First Speaker Meeting (virtual) was held on 24th July 2020, from 7-8.30 pm. This was attended by 22 members, 8 more than the last weekly meeting. At the outset, the President Rtn. Dr S. Minaketan welcomed the participants. After one-minute silence for world peace, he asked Secretary Dr. Samanta to read out the minutes of the last week's meeting.

Dr Samanta referred to the minutes of the last meeting already circulated and asked the participating members whether it could be adopted. The minutes were unanimously adopted. Dr Samanta notified that in view of the restrictions imposed on movement of vehicles until 31st July, 2020, no field activity could be undertaken since what was reported in the last meeting. IPP Rtn.Dr Sarangadahr Samal suggested that the minutes may be sent in original instead of its scanned copy. He also suggested that this period could be profitably utilized by undertaking some in house activities such as inducting new members, establishing Interact and Rotract Clubs, improving collection of membership fees etc. This was followed by the Speaker's Meeting.

The President asked Rtn.Dr P. Srinivas, Joint Secretary, to introduce the speaker, fellow Rotarian Shri Rishipal Singh, who was to speak on the Impact of Climate Change on the Arctic and Polar Bears. Rishipal made a very good PPT presentation of the climate change and how it had impacted the Arctic and Polar Bears which was applauded. The talk was followed by a very interesting discussion with PP Rtn. Vinod Kumar Ji taking the lead. According to him, the focus of the Government in addressing the ill effects of climate change should be on use of public transport, use of renewal energy, large scale plantation etc. He also advocated for use of roof top solar power and not to burn waste by households. The members who also participated in the discussion were Rtn. R. C. Ojha, CP Rtn. Debabrata Panigrahi, IPP Rtn. Dr Samal and a few others. Dr Minaketan thanked Rtn Rishipal for his excellent speech.

This was followed by the release of the second edition of the RCBH E-Bulletin prepared by no other than our beloved Rtn. Shri Chinmaya Mahapatra, who is Editor of Club Bulleting. The efforts of Rtn. Mahapatra was greatly appreciated. IPP Dr. Samal enquired whether the Bulletin could have been circulated before the meeting to which Dr Minaketan replied that it would be circulated to all members soon after this meeting.

Dr Minaketan impressed upon the members to help collecting membership fees and getting advertisement for the Special Bulletin to be released on Installation Ceremony and Charter Day, He asked Secretary to talk to members and form 5 to 6 groups who could help in the collection of membership fees. Dr Samanta mentioned that there a few members who wanted to pay through cheque but could not due to the present lockdown.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks by Rtn, Shri Rajendra Dash and national anthem sung by the participating members. (Minutes sent on 28th July)

5th Weekly and 2nd Speaker Meeting held on 31st July (Virtual):

The Fifth Weekly and Second Speaker Meeting (virtual) were held on 31st July 2020, from 7-8.30 pm. This was attended by 20 members. At the outset, the President Rtn. Dr S. Minaketan welcomed the participants. After one-minute silence for world peace, he asked Secretary Dr. Samanta to read out the minutes of the last week's meeting.

Dr Samanta referred to the minutes of the last meeting already circulated and asked the participating members whether it could be adopted. The minutes were unanimously adopted. Dr Samanta notified that in view of the restrictions imposed on movement of vehicles until 31st July, 2020, no field activity could be undertaken since what was reported in the last meeting. This was followed by the Speaker's Meeting.

The President asked PP Rtn.Shri Santanu Mishra, to introduce the speaker, fellow Rotarian and PP Shri Vinod Kumar, who spoke on the Miyawaki Approach to Afforestation. This approach was introduced in Japan some 7 to 8 years back and now gaining popularity all over the world, including India and Odisha, he added. According to him, the Miyawaki Approach can also be considered co-terminus with Ecosystem Approach. The principle of this Approach is that native plants and traditionally utilized species have capacity to develop a good and self-sustained forest ecosystem in place of non-local trees. The advantage of this approach lies in the fact that while in Conventional plantation, one could have one tree per square meter of space, in Miyawaki Approach one can have 30 trees with 25-30 varieties of species. In spite of a higher initial investment cost, Miyawaki is advocated for various other reasons such as, no maintenance cost after 3 years, less susceptible to pests, balanced ecosystem etc., he emphasized. While leading the question and answer session Club Adviser Rtn. Shri Ashok Kumar Tripathy enquired whether this approach was being used on a larger scale in Odisha to which there was a clear 'NO' from Shri Vionod Kumar; the main reason being the initial cost. He clarified that while a conventional plantation in an area of 2000 square meters require less than Rupees one lakh, for Miyawaki Plantation, it is between Rs. 3-5 lakhs. However the latter is advocated for various other reasons such as, no maintenance cost after 3 years, less susceptible to pests, balanced ecosystem etc. The other member who also participated in the discussion was Rtn. Shri R.C.Ojha. The talk was well appreciated by the 20 and odd members attending the meeting. Dr Minaketan impressed upon the members to help collecting membership fees and getting advertisement for the Special Bulletin to be released on Installation Ceremony and Charter Day. Dr Samanta gave the status of membership fee collection. He mentioned that due to mobility

restrictions, it has not been possible to collect cheques from a few members. Rtn. Shri Rajendra Dash suggested that while collecting the fees one should give a patient hearing to the issues, if

any, raised by a member and try to address the problems so raised. This was agreed to.

First Board Meeting (Virtual) on 07.08.2021:

At the outset President, Dr S. Minaketan called the meeting to order and welcomed the participants. One minute silence was observed for world peace. A total of 18 members participated.

At the request of the President, Secretary Dr B.B.Samanta read out the highlights of the already-circulated minutes of the last Joint Board Meeting held on 26th June, 2020, under the joint Chairmanship of the outgoing and incoming presidents. The minutes were unanimously adopted.

President Dr Minaketan introduced the new Board and the responsibility of the members for the current year. Starting with Dr Rambabu Dandela, a few other members enquired about the rationality of the number of Board members and also allotting the areas of responsibility to them. To this the President clarified that the interest of a member and his/her willingness were a major criterion in inducting him or her into the Board.

This was followed by presentation of a few proposals for approval of the Board such as the 8 new members introduced by the President (4) and Secretary (4), budget for 2020-21 etc. While members appreciated and approved, unanimously, the induction of high quality members, they wanted the same to continue during the year. President requested members to help in raising the membership with the slogan 'each one, get one' President Elect Rtn. Shri P.C.Dash, suggested a slight modification of the slogan, 'Each one, teach one and get one' There was also unanimity in raising the number of women members.

In absence of the Treasurer Rtn. Shri Amit Agrawala, Dr Samanta, while presenting the budget for 2020-21, reminded the members how on June 26th an indicative budget had been prepared and how based on the suggestion of the members it was toned down. According to him, while the earlier budget was around Rs 18 lakhs, the present budget is slightly over Rs. 15 lakhs. He added that in view of the fact that the opening bank balance was Rs 1, 71, 000 plus, this was the bare minimum to carry out the activities planned. IPP Dr Sarangadhar Samal appreciated the efforts put by Dr Samanta and endorsed the amount stated in the budget as the minimum. He also stated that of the opening balance. Rs72,000 was the amount he had received towards membership renewal fees credited to the bank during end June but for the current year. Of the remaining amount, that is close to Rs. One lakh, Dr Samanta mentioned that the entire amount would be kept for creation of an asset for the club, (construction of a Community Center at Bhalunka), as suggested by the IPP. Rtn. Shri Rajendra Das enquired whether there could be a specific allocation for club activities and in its absence there could be problem in implementation of the activities entrusted to the Board members. Dr Samanta mentioned that we have to manage the activities within the budget provision, as raising funds more than what is already included will be difficult. That brought up the contribution from members or getting more advertisements with the help of members. Vice-President Rtn. Shri Manmath Pani, while endorsing this idea, committed raising Rs. 50,000 for the club through advertisement and appealed others to follow. This was greatly appreciated. However, based on the suggestion from Rtn. Shri Rajendra Das and IPP, Dr Samal, President declared that he would form a Committee to examine the possibility of allotting separate funds for specific activities entrusted to the Board members and modify the budget accordingly. Run. Shri Pani suggested a time frame of one week for this purpose. This was agreed to.

As regards holding of a combined Charter Day and Installation Ceremony on 25th August, 2020, President, Dr Minaketan announced the formation of a Committee under the Chairmanship of CP Rtn. Shri Debabrata Panigrahi. Other members of the Committee are IPP Rtn. Dr Sarangadhar Samal, PP Rtn. Shri Santanu Mishra, PP Rtn. Shri Vinod Kumar, Rtn. Shri Bikram Kesahri Ray, Rtn. Shri Amit Agrawalla and Rtn. Shri Chinmaya Mahapatra. The first meeting of the Committee was held on 6th August. Dr Minaketan and Dr Samanta were also present. PP. Shri Santanu Mishra and PP Shri Vinod Kumar could not make it to the meeting. At the request of Dr Minaketan, Dr Samanta briefed the outcome of the meeting as follows.

- It was agreed to have a non-Rotarian as the Chief Guest. Various personalities were subject of discussion.
- One possibility, as first priority, was to have Hon'ble Governor of Odisha. CP Shri Debabrata Panigrhai volunteered to coordinate with Governor's Office. However, the President was to send the letter already drafted for this purpose, with slight change, to Shri Panigrahi, immediately.
- In case Hon'ble Governor was not available, other potential personality could be thought of. Members were requested to keep in mind such possibilities.
- With regard to the Agenda, both IPP Dr Samal and Dr Samanta had prepared a draft Agenda each. It was suggested that it will be more appropriate to confine the event to one hour or a maximum of one and half an hour.
- CP Shri Debabrata Panigrahi took the responsibility to prepare a combined agenda, keeping in mind both the draft Agendas and share with the members. This was agreed to.

This was followed by the release of the Third Club E-Bulletin by the President Dr Minaketan. The Bulletin had been prepared by Rtn. Shri Chinmaya Mahapatra, Editor of the Club. The efforts, put by Shri Mahapatra, were greatly appreciated by the members.

Vice-President, Rtn. Shri Manmath Kumar Pani, proposed a vote of thanks. The meeting was adjourned, after the National Anthem, sung by the participating members. (Shared on 10th August, 2020)

Sixth Weekly and Third Speaker Meeting held on 14.08.2020 (Virtual):

The meeting was called to order by the President, Dr S. Minaketan. This was followed by the Welcome Address by the President. In his address Dr Minaketan announced three club activities to be taken up on the Independence Day, that is, 15th August 2020. These were, undertaking the flag hoisting ceremony by him at ODM School, release of stickers by COVID-19 Management Chairman, Rtn.,Prashanta Kumar Senapati, IAS (Retd.), as a part of the Awareness drive, as suggested by the District Governor and holding an International Youth Day Follow up Lectures by two eminent international speakers, in the evening, Shri Bharadwaj Dayala, International Youth Icon and Rtn. Dr Ehasan Houqe, a doctor turned savior of distressed children. This was to be organized, virtual, by the Club in association with RC of Bhubaneswar, Distressed Children and infants International (DCI), USA, ODM Public School, Kalinga Eye Hospital and NYSASDRI. He then requested Dr Samanta, Club Secretary to read out the minutes of the last Weekly cum Speaker Meeting held on 31st July, 2020.

Dr Samanta, reminded the members, about the minutes, sent to them twice in the past (on 6th and on 12th August) and asked whether they wanted him to read the report again or take the report as adopted. To this the members unanimously adopted the Report.

Dr Minaketan then welcomed the Speaker of the day, Er. Pradip Satpathy, an accomplished engineer turned Yoga Teacher under Art of Living Organization, who was to speak on YOGA and YOUTH. This was to commemorate the International Youth Day celebrated on 12th August. The Topic was Youth Engagement for Global Action. The two speakers were, Youth Icon, Shri Bharadwaj Dayala and Dr Ehasan Hoque, a Medical Doctor turned savior of Distressed Children and Infants (DSI). They mainly spoke on their own experience that could be an eye-opener for the Youth. There were 84 participants.

20th August: District Membership Seminar at 4 PM (Virtual)

Had to postpone our internal meeting with President and CP, for discussion on the Charter Day/Installation Day Ceremony, to 5 pm to enable some of us attend the Seminar. No. of participants from RCBH were 5 (Self, President Dr. Minaketan, IPP Dr Sarangadhar, PP Santatnu Mishra and CP Debabrata Panigrahi).

7th Weekly cum 2nd Business Meeting held on 21st August, 2020 (Virtual):

The Seventh Weekly and Second Business Meeting (virtual) were held on 21st August, 2020 from 7-8.00 pm. This was attended by 15 members. At the outset, the President Rtn. Dr S. Minaketan welcomed the participants. After one-minute silence for world peace, he asked Secretary Dr. Samanta to read out the minutes of the last week's meeting. Dr Samanta referred to the minutes of the last meeting already circulated and asked the participating members whether it could be adopted. The minutes were unanimously adopted. This was followed by the Business Meeting.

In the absence of the CP, Rtn. Shri Debabrata Panigrahi, Dr Minaketan briefed about the arrangements proposed for the ensuing Installation Ceremony and Charter Day celebration plus the Motivational Talk by Mitrananda Ji of Chinmay Mission. He mentioned that as the Hon'ble Governor was not available on 25th, they have requested DG, Rtn. Shri Saumya Ranjan Mishra to be the Chief Guest that he had agreed. The Chief Speaker of the event will be Mitrananda Ji who will deliver a motivational talk on "Dexterity in Action". Dr Minaketan requested the members to join the Virtual Event with family members. The Ceremony would start at 6.30 pm and is expected to continue until 8.30 pm. He encouraged the new members to join the event physically, if possible. A special Bulletin was to be released to commemorate this event, he added.

Dr Minaketan then asked the Secretary, Dr Samanta to give an update of the membership fee collection, statutory payments, and feedback from the Committee on Budget for 2020-21. According to Dr Samanta, while 43 members have already paid, another 15 have already been contacted and consent obtained for payment. Only four or five hard core members have remained and with majority of them no contact could be established so far. However, since we have

already paid the statutory fees for these people to the RI, we will continue to pursue until December, failing which we will have no other option except to remove their names, suggested Dr Samanta. On payment to RI, Dr Samanta mentioned that RCBH is one of the seven clubs (out of 107 in the RI District) that had paid the statutory fees to RI and would soon be paying the dues to the District and Rotary News Trust. Since for CSR, we do not know who will be the agency and what would be its priorities, it will not be appropriate to put activities against the proposed budget of Rs. 200,000. However, we will review the budget by the end of December and based on the information could modify the budget, he added. He, however, clarified that the Chairman/Co-Chairmanr of the concerned areas have to try for sponsors of activities for which they are responsible and only in exceptional cases, they could look for partial help from the common fund set aside for Community Service and Project Dignity. With these clarifications, the budget (Rs. 15, 15, 389.17) was approved.

Rtn. Shri B.K.Sahoo, announced that there was no birth day or marriage anniversary of members or their spouses during the coming week except the birth day of Lord Ganesh that falls on 22^{nd} (Saturday) and our club on 25^{th} .

As there was no other points for discussion, President declared the meeting adjourned but not before a vote of thanks proposed by Rtn. Nirmal Kumar Choudhury and National Anthem, sung by the members.

The 9th Weekly and 2nd Board Meeting (virtual) was held on 11th September, 2020, from 7-8.15 pm. The number of participants was 17 for Weekly Meeting and 14 for Board Meeting. The Board Meeting followed the Weekly Meeting with a different agenda. At the outset, the President Rtn. Dr S. Minaketan welcomed the participants. After one-minute silence for world peace, he asked Secretary Dr. B.B.Samanta to read out the minutes of the last Weekly cum Speaker Meeting held on 04.09.2020.

The minutes were unanimously adopted.

In the absence of Rtn. Shri Bishnumohan Mohanty, Chairman, Literacy Mission, Rtn Chinmaya Mahapatra did the moderation on activities proposed by the members under RILM. It was an open session with Dr Samanta initiating the process. As regards donating books for library, President suggested that this could be done for a school in the 5 adopted villages. This was agreed to. On the issue whether Teacher Felicitation Award should be restricted to government teachers, there was a long discussion. Finally it was agreed that the Club could consider both government and private school teachers. As regards timing, it should now be in October, as per the discussion, the President had with the DG. With regard to Happy School/Joyful Learning, it was agreed that this could be undertaken in some schools of the 5 adopted villages. Dr Samanta mentioned that he would approach UNICEF to get more details of Joyful Learning. He (Dr Samanta) brought to the notice of the members about "Project Dignity", suggested by the DG under RILM and mentioned that a meeting of Government District and Block level officials of Agriculture Department is being called on 12th at 4.30 pm, at a place close to the 5 adopted villages, under the leadership of Rtn. Shri Manmath Pani, Vice-President, to have preliminary discussion on the proposed project.

On the collection of membership fees, Dr Samanta mentioned that so far 46 members have paid (including 2 sponsored by the President who is expected to have paid for them) and barring a couple of members, there is no problem for the rest. He specifically mentioned about his telephonic talk with Rtn. Shri Deepak Mallick who expressed his desire to discontinue his

membership, as he had no time to devote for Club Work. He may pay for half year, Dr Samanta mentioned. He confirmed that the total membership of the Club at present is 61 (including Mr Mallick).

As regards formation of Rotract and Interact Clubs, Chairman Rtn. Shri Chinmaya Mahaptra appealed to Dr Minaketan to revive the Rotract Club of ODM School. He would also take it up with Rtn. Shri Bishnumohan Mohanty to do the same for the defunct Interact Club of Royal School. Dr Samanta suggested that the college run by Rtn. Shri Lucy Mahapatra has a potential for one Rotract Club and he offered to go with Chinmaya for this purpose. Rtn. Chinamay mentioned that he has had a preliminary talk with Loyla School to form an Interact Club.

Rtn. Shri B.K.Sahoo announced the birth day and marriage anniversary of the members and their spouses. All members present joined to greet them.

On"Any other point", Dr Samanta mentioned about an offer made by the NGO (Hunkar Odia), who had helped the Club in relief work to organize a Blood Donation Camp either in Gop or in Bhubaneswar for which they expect RCBH to provide food for the donors, that may be within Rs5,000. President Dr Minaketan expressed his satisfaction and asked Dr Samanta to go ahead with this offer. IPP Dr Sarangadhar Samal suggested the revival of the Club Website and requested Dr P. Srinivas to help.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks by PPE Rtn, Shri P. C. Das and national anthem sung by the participating members.

Keynote Speakers: PDG Shyamashree Sen, Dr (Mrs) Nazneen Ahmed, Sr. Reearch Fellow, Bangladesh, Dr Pravati

Panigrahi, Multi-Cultural Ambassador, Australia and Ina Purohit, District Chairman Inner Wheel District 326. Invitation by Rtn. Prof. Jayanti Jagdev, District Chair, Women Empowerment and Rtn. Debjani Bose, President RC of BBSR Kalinga

18th September 2020:

The weekly cum Speaker Meeting could not be held as the ODM was totally shut down.

10th Weekly & 3rd Business Meeting held on 25th September 2020 (Virtual): The 10th Weekly Meeting was held virtual at 7 pm. As the Speaker for 18th Meeting was not available, it was converted to a Weekly cum 3rd Business Meeting.

The President called the meeting to order. There were 14 participants. After one minute silence for world peace, he (President Dr Minaketan) asked the Secretary to read out the last meeting's minutes. As the minutes had already been circulated at least three times before, Dr Samanta, Secretary, asked the participants whether there was any further need to read out the same or he would take the minutes as adopted. The members present unanimously adopted the minutes. He (Dr Samanta) updated the members on the developments since the last meeting.

This was followed by the President presenting the receipts and payments pertaining to the relief work, meticulously prepared by Kanhu Babu of ODM Public School. According to the report, 14 members contributed a total sum of Rs. 41,500 of which the cash expenditure was Rs. 33, 247 leaving a balance of Rs. 8,253 that could be utilized for any disaster relief in future. Of the materials contributed by IPP Dr Sarangadhar Samal, while the match boxes and candles were used for the flood relief, the seed packets consisting of 10 varieties of seeds were not distributed as the field conditions were not suitable and there was no requirement of these seeds by the farmers at this stage. Dr Samanta mentioned about a suggestion coming from Club Adviser Rtn. Shri Ashok K. Tripathy to explore the possibility of distributing these packets among needy farmers of our 5 adopted tribal villages along with Morenga plants. Dr Minaketan was in agreement with this provided it was preceded by a farmers' training that could only be taken up after the prevailing conditions caused by Covid pandemic improve. Dr Samanta suggested that the contributor Dr Samal may be kept in the loop. Dr Minaketan agreed to speak to Dr Samal and he did not find any problem in doing the same. At this point Dr Samanta brought out the efforts made by the President Dr Minaketan and his team for preparing the packets for flood relief work.. He (Dr Samanta) requested the members to thank the President, Dr Minaketan and his team who took the full responsibility of procuring the flood relief materials, burnt midnight oil for packing and arranging all logistics for procurement and movements to the field. This was applauded by all participants present.

On the status of outstanding membership renewal fees, Dr Minaketan confirmed that he had paid the renewal fees for the two members sponsored by him and they were Prof. Alok Das and Dr Manas Ranjan Swain. This makes the total 46 out of the 61 members listed for this year. On Dr Samanta's suggestion whether the President's office should remind those who had not yet paid

their membership renewal fees, at regular intervals, Dr Minaketan felt that it might not be proper to do so. We should continue to adopt our earlier strategy of putting peer pressure to reduce the outstanding, Dr Minaketan added. PP Rtn. Shri Vinod Kumar suggested for on-line payment of fees rather than payment through cheque.

The 5th Edition of E-magazine was released by the President with support from the Club Editor Rtn. Shri Chinmaya Mahapatra. This was well appreciated by everybody.

As per the usual practice, Rtn. Shri B.K.Sahoo, announced the birth day of the members and their spouses in the following week plus their marriage anniversaries with greetings from all. Before the meeting was adjourned, by the President, Rtn. Jugal Kishore Sahoo, proposed a vote of thanks followed by members singing the National Anthem.

11th Weekly cum 6th Speaker Meeting held Virtual on 2nd October, 2020

President, Dr. S. Minaketan, called the meeting to order. There were 36 participants. While calling for one minute silence for world peace, the President requested members to remember Mahatma Gandhi who was an epitome of non-violence and peace, on his birth day. He then requested the Secretary, Rtn. Dr B.B.Samanta, to read out the last meeting's minutes. As the minutes had already been circulated, at least three times before, Dr Samanta asked the participants whether there was any further need to read out the same or he would take the minutes as adopted. The members present, unanimously adopted the minutes.

Members were in agreement with this.

This was followed Rtn. B. K. Sahoo, announcing the birth day of members and their spouses and their marriage anniversaries. Members greeted the spouse of PP Rtn. Santanu Mishra, Ann Bijaylaxmi Mishra, on her birth day that was being observed on 2nd October.

Before the meeting was adjourned, PP Rtn. Shri Viond Kumar proposed a vote of thanks followed by playing of National Anthem.

12th Weekly and Fourth Business (Virtual) Meeting held on 9th October 2020

The 12th weekly and fourth Business Meeting (virtual) was held on 9th October 2020, from 7-8 pm, with 16 members present. At the beginning, the President Rtn. Dr S. Minaketan welcomed the participants. A one minute silence was observed for World Peace. A video on the 4-way test of Rotary was played that reminded the members about the Rotary principles. This was followed by the President asking the Secretary, Rtn. Dr B. B. Samanta, to read out the minutes of the last week's meeting held on 2nd October 2020. Dr Samanta referred to the minutes already circulated and requested the members to approve it. The minutes were unanimously adopted.

Dr Minaketan initiated the talk on the outstanding membership dues by some members and mentioned that he would be writing to those members a personal note on this.

Dr Minaketan presented an estimated cost of creating in-house facilities for members suffering from mild and moderate COVID-19 infection, under medical supervision. He reconfirmed about setting aside a two bed room apartment for this purpose but wanted funds for equipping the rooms for treatment. It was agreed that once the cost is finalized, an appeal, from President, will go to members to make contribution for obtaining the required equipments. This was agreed to.

15th October, 2020: Global Hand Washing Day (7th Speaker Meeting): Special Session, in collaboration with ODM Educational Group, with Shri Dipak Roy as the Speaker: The theme was "Our hands, Our future". No. of participants 81, that included RCBH members and some students and staff of ODM Public School. The Session went of very well.

13th Weekly and 8th Speaker (Virtual) Meeting held on 16th October, 2020:

The 13th weekly and 8th Speaker Meeting (virtual) was held on 16th October 2020, from 7-8 pm, with 19 members present. At the beginning, the President Rtn. Dr S. Minaketan welcomed the participants. A one minute silence was observed for World Peace. The President announced that since the day was coinciding with the World Polio Day, it is proposed to observe the same. To mark this occasion a Speaker Meeting is being arranged. The Speaker is Dr K. Suresh who was a

Member of the Technical Advisory Group (TAG) for Pulse Polio (IPP) in India and was closely associated with RI in its implementation.

The President then asked Rtn. Dr B.B.Samanta, Secretary, to read out the minutes of the last week's meeting held on 9nd October 2020. Dr Samanta reminded the members about the minutes already circulated and requested them to approve it. The minutes were unanimously adopted.

President welcomed the Speaker Dr K. Suresh and requested Dr P. Srinivas, Joint Secretary to introduce him. This was followed by the President requesting Dr K. Suresh to deliver his address. The theme was, "Vaccine Preventable Diseases with Focus on Polio". Dr Suresh made a good beginning but due to frequent interruption caused by network problem and Zoom Platform at Bangalore he could not complete his address. (At the request of Dr Samanta, Dr Suresh shared copy of his presentation materials to be circulated among members). PP Rtn. Shri Vinod Kumar mentioned about his experience with Food for Work Program outside Odisha and its replication in Odisha, with success.

Hearing these personal experiences of two members, there was a strong feeling among others to organize similar talks in the weekly meetings too. Dr Samanta suggested that every month, one weekly meeting may be set aside where interested members could speak about some interesting events in their working life or post-retirement. This was agreed to. It was suggested that this may start from the first weekly meeting in November, 2020. A suitable name could be given and an announcement made with request to register name by members, at the earliest.

As there was no chance of Dr Suresh resuming his talk, the President requested PP Rtn. Shri Santanu Mishra to propose a vote of thanks. This was followed by playing National Anthem that brought a close to the meeting, by the president declaring the meeting adjourned.

Regular Weekly Meeting:

At the outset, the President Rtn. Dr S. Minaketan welcomed the participants. After one-minute silence for world peace, he asked Secretary Rtn.Dr. B.B.Samanta to read out the minutes of the last Weekly cum Speaker Meeting held on 16.10..2020.

Dr Samanta referred to the minutes of the last meeting already circulated thrice and made a brief summary of the meeting's outcome. He asked the participating members whether it could be adopted. The minutes were unanimously adopted. This was followed by the President announcing the end of the Weekly Meeting.

Board Meeting:

President welcomed the Board Members and requested Secretary Dr Samanta to read out the minutes of the 2nd Board Meeting held on 11.09.2020, which had already been circulated. However since more than month has elapsed since the 2nd Board Meeting Dr Samanta brought out the highlights of this meeting and the follow up points. With this, the minutes were unanimously adopted.

- 1. In view of the importance of the Community Service and ill health of its Chairman Rtn. Shri Ranjit K. Mohapatra, a very respected senior Rotarian, the President requested the members present to suggest a replacement. It was unanimously agreed to request VP, Rotarian Sheri Manmath Pani as Chairman, Community Service, with CP Rotarian Shri Debabrata Panigrahi as Co-Chairman. - 2. As a young officer (he was only four and half years in Indian Forest Service then) he felt very proud for this achievement.

The second member to speak was the versatile Rtn. Shri Jaganath Prasad Jagdev. He briefed about an innovative project for OREDA in which he had successfully demonstrated how the proper management of a system, using technology, could address a major problem successfully. In this case he developed a very effective monitoring system for 13,000 solar based water supply systems in remote areas of the State that brought down the pump breakdown time significantly and that OREDA had now adopted it as its policy for uninterrupted supply of drinking water in the remotest part of Odisha. It is but natural for him to feel very proud.

The last speaker was Rtn. Shri R. C. Ojha, a retired Dy. General Manager of Punjab National Bank, who spoke about his achievement when he was a Manager in one of the branches in Delhi.

There, he was instrumental to open a bank branch in an unbanked area, near Delhi, with all odds and successfully enhanced its business beyond expectation. The number of accounts opened within a year was around 4,000 of which 275 were industrial accounts. This also induced other banks to open new branches that they were avoiding so far. In a way Rtn. Shri Ojha showed them the way. As regards business, the deposits of the Branch opened by Rtn. Ojha, grew from zero to Rs. 60 crores with in a year. Initially, this was beyond his imagination and hence he feels very proud.

Dr Minaketan thanked the speakers for their talk and the time they spent with the members and then requested Rtn. B.K.Sahoo to announce the birth days and marriage anniversaries of the members and their spouses that Shri Sahoo did.

After a vote of thanks by Rtn. and Joint Secretary Dr P. Srinivas and playing of National Anthem, the President declared the meeting adjourned.

Day, on 5th June 2021, Dr Samanta, mentioned about having a speaker, Shri Bijay Kumar Rabi, Director Action for Protection of Wild Animals (APOWP) to speak on this year's theme, "Restoration of Eco-Systems", in the evening. This has been suggested by Rtn. Shri Rishipal Singh, who also has enquired about the feasibility of RCBH involved in the plantation of Mangroves in certain parts of Jagatsinghpur to protect against cyclone that has become almost a routine one. Dr Minaketan mentioned about his plan to go for Avenue Plantation, with 5 to 6 feet high plants, in about a km length of road near Bhalunka, where the community will be involved for watering and maintenance. Members suggested Dr Minaketan to consult with PP Rtn. Vinod Kumar, on this issue and then act accordingly.

ORIENTATION OF NEW MEMBERS: Although this was meant for newly inducted members, many of the old members profited by it since over the past three to four years no such orientation had taken place in the Club. Shri K.C.Mohanty, R.C.Ojha, Col l.Mahapatra and Jugal Kishore Sahoo. Other members who were present were, CP Rtn. Debabrata Panigrahi, Rtn. Manmath Pani, Vice President and Rtn. Dr P.Srinivas, Joint Secretary. On the whole the Camp went of very well. 37 people had Random Blood Sugar Test where as 22 had ECG.

 - iv) Blood and Plasma Collection Rtn. Shri Rajendra Kumar Das and Rtn. Shri R.C.Ojha,
 - v) Medicine Supply IPP Rtn. Dr. Sarangadhar Samal & Rtn. Dr P.Srinivas, Joint Secretary
 - vi) Coordination and Media Rtn. Shri B.K.Sahoo & Rtn. Shri Chinmaya Mahapatra

It was reiterated that the role of the sub-group members will be mainly that of a facilitator rather than a provider. It was suggested that President should talk to all members personally and get their final consent.

The President Dr Minaketan made a very pleasing surprise by announcing some steps he had already taken to establish Isolation Centers for the staff of ODM School that could also be used by the members and their families. BOARD MEETING:

ROTARY FIRSTS

- The first Rotary club meeting was in Chicago, Illinois, on February 23,1905
- The first regular luncheon meetings were in Oakland, California, chartered in 1909.
- The first Rotary convention was in Chicago in 1910
- The first Rotary club outside of the United States was chartered in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, in 1910.
- The first Rotary club outside of North America was chartered in Dublin, Ireland, in 1911.
- The first Rotary club in a non-Englishspeaking country was in Havana, Cuba, in 1916.
- The first Rotary club in South America was chartered in Montevideo, Uruguay, in 1918.
- The first Rotary club in Asia was chartered in Manila, Philippines, in 1919.
- The first Rotary club in Africa was chartered in Johannesburg, South Africa, in 1921
- The first Rotary club in Australia was chartered in Melbourne in 1921. (original idea from "Scandal Sheet"



In 1932 Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor created the Four-Way Test, a code of ethics adopted by Rotary 11 years later. The test which has been translated into more than 100 languages, asks the following questions:

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build **GOODWILL** and **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?**
- 4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?



Paul Harris:

Rotary's Founder

Paul P. Harris. Paul Harris at age 3, around the time he moved to his grandparents' home. Harris was born on 19 April 1868 in Racine, Wisconsin, USA. At age 3, he moved to Wallingford, Vermont, where he grew up in the care of his paternal grandparents. He attended the University of Vermont and Princeton University and received his law degree from the University of lowa in 1891.

In 1896, Harris settled in Chicago and opened a law practice. Four years later, he met fellow attorney Bob Frank for dinner on Chicago's North Side. They walked around the area, stopping at shops along the way. Harris was impressed that Frank was friendly with many of the shopkeepers. He had not seen this kind of camaraderie among businessmen since moving to Chicago and wondered if there was a way to channel it, because it reminded him of growing up in Wallingford.



"The thought persisted that I was experiencing only what had happened to hundreds, perhaps thousands, of others in the great city. ... I was sure that there must be many other young men who had come from farms and small villages to establish themselves in Chicago. ... Why not bring them together? If others were longing for fellowship as I was, something would come of it."

Harris eventually persuaded several business associates to discuss the idea of forming an organization for local professionals. On 23 February 1905, Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram Shorey gathered at Loehr's office in downtown Chicago for what would become known as the first Rotary club meeting. In February 1907, Harris was elected the third president of the Rotary Club of Chicago. Toward the end of his presidency, he worked to expand Rotary beyond the city. Some club members resisted, not wanting to take on the additional financial burden. But Harris persisted, and by 1910, Rotary had expanded to several other major U.S. cities.

Harris recognized the need to form a national association with an executive board of directors. In August 1910, Rotarians held their first national convention in Chicago, where the 16 existing clubs unified as the National Association of Rotary Clubs (now Rotary International). The new association unanimously elected Harris as its president. At the end of his second term as Rotary president, Harris resigned, citing ill health and the demands of his professional practice and personal life. He was elected president emeritus by convention action, a title he held until his death.

In the mid-1920s, Harris became actively involved in Rotary again, serving as the public face of the organization. To promote membership and service, he attended conventions and visited clubs throughout the world, often accompanied by his wife, Jean. Harris died on 27 January 1947 in Chicago at age 78, after a prolonged illness. Before his death, he made it known that he preferred contributions to The Rotary Foundation in lieu of flowers. By coincidence, days before he died, Rotary leaders had committed to a major fundraising effort for the Foundation.

Upon news of his death, Rotary created the Paul Harris Memorial Fund as a way to solicit these donations. Rotarians were encouraged to commemorate the late founder of Rotary by contributing to the fund, which would be used for purposes dear to Harris' heart. In the 18 months following his death, The Rotary Foundation received \$1.3 million, which helped support the Foundation's first program — scholarships for graduate study abroad.







Giving Is Good for You



Holiday shopping can be terrifying, yes. But research suggests it's worth it: New studies attest to the benefits of giving—not just for the recipients but for the givers' health and happiness, and for the strength of entire communities.

Of course, you don't have to shop to reap the benefits of giving. Research suggests the same benefits come from donating to charities or volunteering your time, like at a soup kitchen or a homeless shelter. Here are some of the ways that giving is good for you and your community.

- **1. Giving makes us feel happy.** A 2008 study by Harvard Business School professor Michael Norton and colleagues found that giving money to someone else lifted participants' happiness more that spending it on themselves (despite participants' prediction that spending on themselves would make them happier). Happiness expert Sonja Lyubomirsky, a professor of psychology at the University of California, Riverside, saw similar results when she asked people to perform five acts of kindness each week for six weeks. These good feelings are reflected in our biology. In a 2006 study, Jorge Moll and colleagues at the National Institutes of Health found that when people give to charities, it activates regions of the brain associated with pleasure, social connection, and trust, creating a "warm glow" effect. Scientists also believe that altruistic behavior releases endorphins in the brain, producing the positive feeling known as the "helper's high."
- **2. Giving is good for our health.** A wide range of research has linked different forms of generosity to better health, even among the sick and elderly. In his book Why Good Things Happen to Good People, Stephen Post, a professor of preventative medicine at Stony Brook University, reports that giving to others has been shown to increase health benefits in people

with chronic illness, including HIV and multiple sclerosis. A 1999 study led by Doug Oman of the University of California, Berkeley, found that elderly people who volunteered for two or more organizations were 44 percent less likely to die over a five-year period than were non-volunteers, even after controlling for their age, exercise habits, general health, and negative health habits like smoking. Stephanie Brown of the University of Michigan saw similar results in a 2003 study on elderly couples. She and her colleagues found that those individuals who provided practical help to friends, relatives, or neighbors, or gave emotional support to their spouses, had a lower risk of dying over a five-year period than those who didn't. Interestingly, receiving help wasn't linked to a reduced death risk. Researchers suggest that one reason giving may improve physical health and longevity is that it helps decrease stress, which is associated with a variety of health problems. In a 2006 study by Rachel Piferi of Johns Hopkins University and Kathleen Lawler of the University of Tennessee, people who provided social support to others had lower blood pressure than participants who didn't, suggesting a direct physiological benefit to those who give of themselves.

3. Giving promotes cooperation and social connection. When you give, you're more likely to get back: Several studies, including work by sociologists Brent Simpson and Robb Willer, have suggested that when you give to others, your generosity is likely to be rewarded by others down the line-sometimes by the person you gave to, sometimes by someone else. These exchanges promote a sense of trust and cooperation that strengthens our ties to others—and research has shown that having positive social interactions is central to good mental and physical health. As researcher John Cacioppo writes in his book Loneliness: Human Nature and the Need for





Social Connection, "The more extensive the reciprocal altruism born of social connection . . . the greater the advance toward health, wealth, and happiness." What's more, when we give to others, we don't only make them feel closer to us; we also feel closer to them. "Being kind and generous leads you to perceive others more positively and more charitably," writes Lyubomirsky in her book The How of Happiness, and this "fosters a heightened sense of interdependence and cooperation in your social community."

4. Giving evokes gratitude. Whether you're on the giving or receiving end of a gift, that gift can elicit feelings of gratitude it can be a way of expressing gratitude or instilling gratitude in the recipient. And research has found that gratitude is integral to happiness, health, and social bonds. Robert Emmons and Michael McCullough, co-directors of the Research Project on Gratitude and Thankfulness, found that teaching college students to "count their blessings" and cultivate gratitude caused them to exercise more, be more optimistic, and feel better about their lives overall. A recent study led by Nathaniel Lambert at Florida State University found that expressing gratitude to a close friend or romantic partner strengthens our sense



of connection to that person. Barbara pioneering Fredrickson. happiness a researcher, suggests that cultivating gratitude in everyday life is one of the keys to increasing personal happiness. "When you express your gratitude in words or actions, you not only boost your own positivity but [other people's] as well," she writes in her book Positivity. "And in the process you reinforce their kindness and strengthen your bond to one another."

5. Giving is contagious. When we give, we don't only help the immediate recipient of our gift. We also spur a ripple effect of generosity through our community. A study by James Fowler of the University of California, San Diego, and Nicholas Christakis of Harvard, published in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Science, shows that when one person behaves generously, it inspires observers to behave generously later, toward different people. In fact, the researchers found that altruism could spread by three degrees from person to person to person. "As a result," they write, "each person in a network can influence dozens or even hundreds of people, some of whom he or she does not know and has not met." Giving has also been linked to the release of oxytocin, a hormone (also released during sex and breast feeding) that induces feelings of warmth, euphoria, and connection to others. In laboratory studies, Paul Zak, the director of the Center for Neuroeconomics Studies at Claremont Graduate University, has found that a dose of oxytocin will cause people to give more generously and to feel more empathy towards others, with "symptoms" lasting up to two hours. And those people on



an "oxytocin high" can potentially jumpstart a "virtuous circle, where one person's generous behavior triggers another's," says Zak.

So whether you buy gifts, volunteer your time, or donate money to charity this holiday season, your giving is much more than just a year-end chore. It may help you build stronger social connections and even jumpstart a cascade of generosity through your community. And don't be surprised if you find yourself benefiting from a big dose of happiness in the process.

Changing Precipitation in Odisha

We are in the middle of a pandemic and we are crossing 70000 cases daily but somehow it has become the new normal. We are having about 1000 daily deaths due to corona virus in India. This has blurred our vision completely to such an extent that we have turned a blind eye to other important issues which needs attention. One of the deadliest issues is Climate Change- which has been put to the backburners of our minds. People say, its slow but it is changing the socio economic landscape rapidly. The 3rd world countries are agreeing to adopt green and cleaner technologies but on the other hand, the so called first world countries have taken out their support from the very important Paris Agreement deal on Climate change.

The present time is probably the only time when humanity has a chance to reverse back the man made global warming and injury inflicted on mother earth. But all efforts would go in vain if every country in the world do not come to a common ground and agree on the measures to be adopted to curb climate change catastrophes. We also had heat looming over Arctic circle and temperatures recorded there was 30+ degrees Celsius. As a coastal state we cannot really wait every summer and october for a new typhoon and live our lives in terror after hearing every depression situation in Bay Of bengal. This is the right time we need to act. The Government is for sure doing its job but as responsible citizens, we need to do our part too. We need to take certain measures at our end to reduce our individual carbon footprint, protest against the insensitive chopping of trees, keep our Air Conditioners at 24 degrees celcius, avoid wastage of water and electricity by not keeping our devices on standby, by using public transport, by trying to install a solar panel at our homes (This will reap benefits for the years to come) and finally by planting a tree and taking care of it.

for Rotary in its 2nd Century

"Rotary's Membership has become stagnant..."

"Rotary's Membership is stuck at 1.2 Million for 2 decades..."

"We need to bring in new members to cross the barrier..."

"Each One, Bring One..."



How many times have we heard these sentences from Rotary leaders from the stage? Almost every Rotary event worldwide repeats these words, even in regions where Rotary has been consistently growing over the last decade. Rotary first reached the 1.2M mark in the mid-nineties and it has been a matter of concern for Rotary leaders worldwide that the oldest and one of the finest humanitarian service organisations across the globe is not growing. And do you understand what this means? It means we are not able to strengthen ourselves further to empower ourselves to expand our reach of service. It also means we do not have enough hands to accelerate the pace of the difference that we want to make to this world. It means we are taking a little too much time to organise, gather resources and implement humanitarian projects. So, what is the problem? Why has our membership become stagnant inspite of our experience of adding so many new members in every Installation Ceremony and adding new so many clubs every year?

The answer is more members leave Rotary than we are able to add every year. The big problem is Retention, not that of inviting new members. And what is the solution? The solution lies in adopting a holistic approach including adding new members and ensuring their retention.

How to do it? One, add new members, no doubt. We need more like-minded people, service minded people, people with a helping spirit, people who are willing to go all the way to make the life of a fellow human better. If we make a new thumb-rule, why can't we think of adding 1 new member per existing member every year? Can we not find 1 worthy person in a 1000 people that we know who could be a potential Rotarian? If not, we are in a wrong circle of people. It is just that we do not care to invite. Someone invited us into Rotary, and it is our first and foremost duty to carry forward that legacy. Everyone, bring one, every year. Two, expand the reach of Rotary to unrepresented areas/regions of the population. Look out for possibilities of starting new Rotary clubs in cities/towns where there is none. In distant rural places, start with a satellite club, and gradually convert them into a separate new Rotary club. Every taluka headquarter in India should have a Rotary club. Three, member orientation. Obviously, an ignorant Rotarian is sure to exit. Proper member orientation before and after granting membership is very important and mostly neglected. Four, member engagement. The most disastrous reason for members leaving Rotary is that they are not engaged. They are not heard. They are not understood. They are not given any importance. They are not given any responsibility. They are not included. Every individual joining Rotary has a purpose and a dream of the organisation and own role in it. If the club does not match his purpose, it leads to member disinterest and exit. Groupism, politics, self-promotion, and disregard to traditions, rules & protocols, whims of club leaders – all lead to member disinterest. Five, effectively interesting programs. A balance of fellowship activities and service projects through informative & knowledge sharing meetings, community service projects, family participation, and selfgrowth opportunities keep members interested. Plan the year accordingly.

It is our duty to think about Rotary Membership. It is our duty to contribute in this aspect. Any Rotarian neglecting this duty is not a worthy Rotarian. Do not only add members, mentor them, nurture them, motivate them, inspire them. Let us make a target – let's resolve to double the membership of our club in 3 years. Make a plan for your club and execute it. It is my challenge to you.

Rotary Seventh Area of Focus

SUPPORTING THE ENVIRONMENT



The Rotary Foundation Trustees and Rotary International Board of Directors have both unanimously approved adding a new area of focus: supporting the environment. More than \$18 million in Foundation global grant funding has been allocated to environment-related projects over the past five years. Creating a distinct area of focus to support the environment will give Rotary members even more ways to bring about positive change in the world and increase our impact. RI President Mark Maloney says that during his travels around the world as a Rotary senior leader he encountered many Rotary members and Rotaractors who advocated for the environment to be an area of focus. "I believe strongly that our Rotary Foundation programs now have a valuable added dimension to our efforts," says, Maloney. Foundation Trustee Chair Gary C.K. Huang says that with the global population reaching near eight billion, protecting the environment is increasingly important. "It is time for us to use our collective resources to invest in a smart and efficient way to protecting our environment," says Huang. "We are qualified to take this initiative because we are a global group of problem solvers with diversified talents." In 1990-91, RI President Paulo V.C. Costa made the environment one of his primary causes, creating the Preserve Planet Earth subcommittee, which looked at ways clubs and members could conduct environmental initiatives. "We have finally caught up to Costa [his vision]," says Past RI President Ian H.S. Riseley, chair of the Environmental Issues task force, which championed the new area of focus. "As a lifelong environmentalist, I'm delighted that our great organization has recognized that the environment is a worthy and appropriate destination for our project activity," says Riseley. "This is an exciting moment in Rotary history." Supporting the environment becomes Rotary's seventh area of focus, which are categories of service activities supported by global grants. It joins peacebuilding and conflict prevention; disease prevention and treatment; water, sanitation, and hygiene; maternal and child health; basic education and literacy; and community economic development. Grant applications for projects will be accepted beginning on 1 July 2021. Gifts and commitments from Rotarians and others will be sought to provide global grant support for the new area of focus. Rotary International President Barry Rassin had said that our environment is 'ultimate mission'. Why should Rotarians care about climate change?

We're people who care about our world. We want our world to be a better place, and it's not just about the six specific areas of focus. It's broader than that. We have to look at the world as a whole and how we can make it a better place. If we're losing countries due to sea level changes, if stronger storms are disrupting water supplies or destroying people's livelihoods, that's more people

who are going to be disadvantaged. So caring about the environment goes toward our ultimate mission, and we should give it the importance it deserves. As a humanitarian organization, we're obligated to talk about it. We need to have the conversation.

All earlier six of Rotary's areas of focus are closely linked to the environment.

PROMOTING PEACE:

The connections between the environment and peace are many and complex.

Good management of ecosystems can lead to cooperative, resilient communities. Poor management of the environment undermines both natural and social systems. The resulting scarcities and competition for water and other natural resources can lead to increased insecurity, climate induced migration, and refugees.

FIGHTING DISEASE:

A healthy environment tends to lead to healthier people. Investing in environmental sustainability can promote our wellbeing. The degradation of the environment — the air we breathe, the food we eat, the water we drink, and the ecosystems that sustain us — is responsible for an estimated 1 in 4 deaths across the globe.

PROVIDING CLEAN WATER AND SANITATION:

Too many people in the world still lack access to safe drinking water, sanitation, and hygiene—basic elements of health and dignity. Effective management and protection of the environment is critical for successful water and sanitation programmes and can reduce risks to water supplies due to flooding, pollution, improperly managed sanitation, extreme precipitation events, and over extraction.

SAVING MOTHERS AND CHILDREN:

Approximately. 7 million children under five die each year from lower respiratory infections and diarrheal diseases. Cleaning up the environment reduces preventable and premature deaths, improves the health of the children who survive, benefits their mothers, and improves the wellbeing of the entire family.





SUPPORTING EDUCATION:

Nature education creates better stewards of the air, land, water, and wildlife, which is critical for the sustainability of everyone's health. Young minds in well-nourished and healthy bodies are better able to benefit from education and literacy.

GROWING LOCAL ECONOMIES:

Prudent environmental practices support industry, agriculture, and services to meet both current and future needs of a community. Tapping alternative energy sources to reduce energy poverty and support local economies is essential for progress in all of the other areas of focus. For example, strategic microfinancing enables a community to install and use a solar-powered grid. Communities and their economies flourish when the air and water are clean, and nourishing food promotes health and well-being.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTION ON ASHA KIRAN

Q1. What is child development program of RILM?

Child Development is a program of RILM to send children back to school. Under Child development program children from vulnerable communities who have never been enrolled to any School or have been dropped out of school, are send back to school after required brushing up. The objective is to facilitate these children's access to mainstream state funded primary / elementary schools.

Q2. What is ASHA KIRAN?

ASHA KIRAN – A ray of hope is the name given to the Child Development initiative to send 100,000 out of school children back to school. This program has been undertaken to fulfill the goals of Child Development vertical of RILM.

Q3. What are the activities undertaken in ASHA KIRAN project?

- Identify children between 7 to 14 years, never enrolled / dropped out/ laggard in studies from vulnerable communities.
- Bring these children to intermediary centre to provide necessary supplemental / non formal education to shore up their learning abilities.
- Counsel and encourage the parents to send their children to regular formal schools.
- Mobilise community on "Right to Free and compulsory Education Act 2009"
- Evaluate learning ability, prepare the children and enroll them to local Govt or Govt aided schools.
- Monitor the attendance of the child in schools for 3 to 6 months.

Q4. Who are ASHA Kiran Children?

- The Child is between age group 7 to 14 years
- Child who has never been to school
- Child who is not attending school but nominally enrolled, irregular or absent for more than 45 days without informing the school

Priorities to be given to following socially vulnerable groups:

children at risk, like children of inmates, children in conflict with law, runaway children, children of sex workers, children of migrant workers, victims of child labour practices, HIV positive children, children of HIV positive parents, orphans and children in need of care and protection.

Q5. What is the definition of out of School Children?

A child between 7 to 14 years of age who has stopped going to school or irregular in school for 3 to 6 months is to be considered as out of School child. As per Sarva Siksha Abhiyan (SSA) "A child who is not attending schools at a stretch of 45 days without any information is at the edge of being dropped out".

Q6. How is the program implemented?

ASHA KIRAN initiative is being implemented by NGOs across country. Nongovernmental, non profit organisations working in the field of child education are engaged in identifying and mainstreaming these children. These organisations are registered under either societies or trust act.

Q7. How these organisations are selected?

An open advertisement has been given in website to call for proposal fom NGOs across country. These proposals are reviewed at desk level. Short listed organizations are visited by RILM staff members. After screening, A MoU is signed between RILM and the organisation to formalise the agreed plan of action. At this point organizations are requested to collect details of the identified children in stipulated format.

Q8. What is the role of Rotary Club in ASHA KIRAN project?

A Rotary Club can

- Sponsor as many Children they want @ Rs 2100.
- Support RILM in finding right NGOs to work in ASHA KIRAN.
- Visit NGOs to validate the identified Children.
- Periodic visit to intermediary center run by NGO and give feedback to RILM.

Q9. How Rs 2100 is spent?

AN NGO receives maximum of Rs 2000 to send one child back to school. The money is not paid as admission or school fees. The money is spent over a period of six to twelve months to pay for,

- Salary of teacher / social mobilizer at intermediary center.
- Educational materials to children.
- Center running cost.

Q10. Is this a onetime payment?

This is one time payment and you shall not be required to pay for the same child again. If you wish to donate again the funds will be utilised in sponsoring a new child.

Q11. Will I be able to know whom I am sponsoring?

Yes, you will be able to know who you are sponsoring. Once a child is assigned to your name, you can see the profile and subsequent progress of the child online at www.rotaryteach.org.

Q12. How can I sponsor a child?

You can sponsor a child by contributing Rs. 2100. You can pay through:-

The best place to find God is in a garden. You can dig for him there.



In order to restore the normal living condition, RCBH team-initiated Cash for work measures from 10th July'2019. The villagers worked for cleaning/renovating their 37 water bodies, community structures, roads against their labor, daily wages were paid. A total 3291-person days were created for the cleaning, repair and renovation of community structures and roads of the hamlets and villages.

WASH in Schools or WASH through Schools? — The Dilemma

Rtn.Dr B.B.Samanta INTRODUCTION:

WASH *in* Schools and WASH *though* Schools are, many a time, interpreted as synonymous. This is probably the reason why providing safe water and improved sanitation together with hand washing facility is considered as the end of promoting WASH among school children.

This is based on the assumption that providing these facilities will lead, automatically, to their use by children and through them create demand in their facilities and ultimately in the community. But unfortunately this has not happened. There are many instances where the toilets, provided in school, are not in use or under lock and key. A similar situation emerges when it comes to hand washing facility and even water facility provided through hand pumps. A major reason for this phenomenon has been lack of demand and motivation among the school children themselves. Besides, adequate efforts have not been made to put the WASH strategy into the school system. For any behavioral change to succeed, it is essential that the motivational efforts need to be institutionalized rather than having an ad hoc approach. In the recent past several efforts have gone in promoting sanitation and hygiene in schools with disappointing outcome. Whether we talk of strategies like WASH in Schools or Wins or the Three Star Approach to WASH or Child Friendly/Happy School, the outcome has fallen short of the objectives, barring some exceptions. In the present paper, an attempt has been made on how to implement the WASH in Schools with better outcome. This is based on the author's own experience both in India and abroad.

OBJECTIVES OF WASH THROUGH SCHOOLS:

The major objective of **WASH through School** should be to promote better hygiene practices among students and though them, among families and ultimately among the communities on a sustainable basis, that will contribute to a significant improvement in the health and well being of people, particularly children and women and not to confine the WASH interventions within the four walls of a school. The specific objectives are:

- Adoption of a participatory approach in creating awareness among teachers and students, with greater involvement of the latter.
- Involvement of the community, through the Parents-teachers Association, for improving the school environment.
- Improvement of environmental sanitation situation in schools and the community.
- Improvement of the existing water and sanitation/hygiene facilities in schools to inculcate better hygiene practices.
- Ensuring children's rights to a cleaner and healthier environment.
- Institutionalization of the awareness and adoption strategy

GUIDING PRINCIPLES:

The strategy for WASH **through** Schools should be based on the following five guiding principles some of which are interlinked to one another.

Conceptualization: What to promote: It should be looked at from two main angles, one to create awareness on better hygiene practices and two to generate demand for safe water and sanitary/hygiene facilities. So far as the first part is concerned it should focus on the seven components of safe water, sanitation and hygiene. These are, i) safe handling of drinking water, ii) safe disposal of waste water, iii) safe disposal of human excreta including child excreta, iv) solid waste disposal, v) home sanitation and food hygiene, vi) personal hygiene and vii) environmental sanitation or community sanitation. In each component, a couple of key messages could be identified that have greater impact on health and nutritional status of people in general and children in particular. Of the seven components, the first six could be included as a part of the daily prayer and the seventh component, that is, the Community Sanitation, could be taken up on specific days when the students move out to the community to promote sanitation and hygiene.

Visualization: How to promote: This will include the whole planning process and will call for creative thinking on the type of IEC materials most appropriate for disseminating the messages, the facilities to be established in the school and in the community for the adoption of hygiene practices, the channels to be used, mechanism for meeting the demand for water and sanitary facilities and so on. One suggestion is to use three or four key messages on the first six components during the daily prayer and the seventh component viz., Environmental Sanitation or Community Sanitation on special occasions that can involve the community. For example, on Monday the theme for prayer could be safe handling of drinking water and on Tuesday safe disposal of waste water and so on.

Mobilization: With whom to promote: This will include the whole range of partners with whom alliance has to be built to implement the proposed activities. At each level it will be necessary to mobilize the key partners for their involvement in achieving the key project objectives relating to what has been conceptualized and visualized. Providing the required exposure to the key partners through visits to successful project areas, training and orientation would be needed for this purpose. Formation of student peer groups/ student cabinets and their orientation should also form a part of such exposure. The concept and the way it has been visualized should be acceptable to the partners. Launching the project will be the ultimate aim of this part.

Stabilization: How to consolidate: Once the project is on ground, it will be necessary to ensure its proper implementation which could be achieved through close monitoring and follow up besides providing constant feedback on the issues that may come up from time to time, and finding a solution. Any mid-course correction need should be part of this phase.

Institutionalization: How to put the strategy into the system and create a mechanism for replication and going to scale: The institutionalization process will go along with the stabilization process. Since the project has the acceptance of all the partners involved, right from the beginning and they are involved in the project implementation and getting the feedback, it will be easy to replicate the project and go to scale. Developing Work Book on Sanitation and Hygiene, separately for each class, could be a useful intervention in this phase, along with conveying selected messages during the daily prayer. These will form a part of the institutionalization process.



When someone rises from acutely humble background of a single tin-shed of slum school with merely 10 students to build an empire of corporate group of education with global schooling benchmark with thousands of bright students, hundreds of smart teachers and innumerable national and international laurels, the whole world around naturally stares. While in his village and from the time he was studying in class IX, he also fought bravely for social justice in welfare of the forbidden and downtrodden people, for child rights, casteism, atrocity against women which are clearly mentioned in his autobiography 'Manisha Gadha Karigar'.

While doing his graduation at **RCE**, he showed his brilliance not only in education but also in cultural and philanthropic activities. Being one of the only eight students for admission
